Copycat Celebs


Celebrities should take accountability for copyright infringement

erds are socially awkward and book smart. Jocks are rebellious and unfiltered. Popular girls are exclusive and mean. Theater kids are geeky and dramatic. Those are a few of the many cliques portrayed through the media, specifically movies such as "Mean

Girls," "The Outsiders" and "Sixteen Candles." The accuracy of the portrayal of cliques in the media is questionable. Many times, the way the cliques are shown throughout the media are, for one, exaggerated and largely based on inaccurate generalizations.

Most times the media shows a clear, distinct line between the popular kids, the geeks, the nerds and the jocks. For example, in various movies the cliques are shown to be separated in a cafeteria setting and you would only be able to sit with a certain group if you fell into that group's criteria.
